### Advice on Coronavirus/Corvid 19

As you are aware both locally and nationally, we are facing a heightened risk of the novel Coronavirus, (Corvid 19), being the source of widespread illness and disruption to the normal daily life of us all including the parents/carers and children of Gorse Hill School and Nursery.

Quite rightly this has caused a number of parents to ask what we are doing to contain the spread in our school and what other advice we can offer and this letter is an attempt to support those questions wherever we can but we recognise that even at the point of writing this is a fast moving situation and subject to change.

#### Will the school be closing?

We have received the following update from the DfE which states that:

*"...We would like to remind colleagues in schools that no school should close in response to a suspected (or confirmed) COVID-19 case unless directed to do so by Public Health England (PHE). The risk assessments carried out by PHE are very thorough and their team will also communicate with all people who need to self-isolate or be tested following a case being confirmed..."*

So, to be clear the school will only close as a result of direct contact with PHE England, the local authority and the Trust leadership including the CEO of the Trust DR Nicholas Capstick O.B.E.

- In the unlikely event of our school needing to partially close we are currently advancing our own plans due to the spread of the virus. A partial shutdown may occur if a number of staff were forced to either self-isolate or fell ill.

In such cases the School would prioritise the teaching of the SATs groups in Years 2 and 6

- If a full shut down were to occur, the School is working on plans to carry on teaching and learning via its website where online learning will be signposted for year groups to access, such as BBC Bitesize and Phonics play.

In addition, the Department for Education (DfE) has launched a coronavirus (COVID-19) advice service for the education sector, including staff, parents, carers and young people. The relevant details are detailed below:

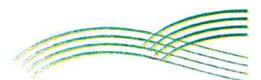


