### Home learning:

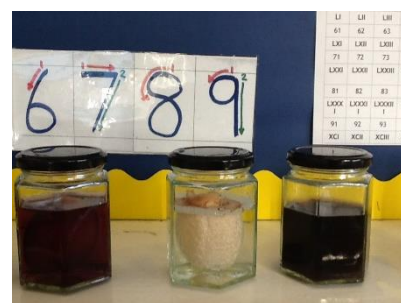
